## The Court notes as mentioned in its previous Order at Docket No. 3259 that the issue of delayed provider payments is a recurring and systemic matter. In July of this year the JCC informed of such a situation. <u>See</u> Docket No. 2944. Following a Court order directing DSPDI to respond, <u>see</u> Docket No. 2947, the Commonwealth committed itself to resolving the matter once and for all:

In particular, regarding payments to providers, the DSPDI is fully committed to implementing a process whereby providers are paid without delay, and has designed an Action Plan to address the situation. A copy of such Action Plan was also submitted to the special investigator together with the Statement of Account. The purpose of the Action Plan is to establish a system for monitoring and timely payment of all provider invoices. The DSPDI is fully committed to this effort, and to working with the providers to improve the submission and payment of their invoices, all within the requirements of the Commonwealth's payment systems. See Informative Motion Regarding Compliance with Request from Special Investigator at Docket No. 2963 at Paragraph 7.

The Court, thus, unfortunately finds that the Commonwealth at this time has not lived up to its assurances to remedy on its own the matter of delayed payments to providers. This is not acceptable, as it will result in the implosion and collapse of essential services to participants.
